Amalgamated Security Services Limited (ASSL,) in partnership with the Association of Caribbean Commissioners of Police (ACCP), annually recognize 9 Caribbean Police Officers for their outstanding achievements in three categories (i) Best Crime Fighter (ii) Best Community Policing Officer and (iii) the Police Officer with the Best Career Development. Each year Caribbean Commissioners of Police nominate Officers who excel in these areas and an independent international panel of judges selects the 9 awardees who are then flown to the Caribbean country that hosts the yearly ACCP AGM, to be publicly recognized for their excellence in service. The Police Force of the three first place winners each receive five thousand US Dollars towards their further development. In 2019, at the 34th AGM and Conference of the ACCP, the joint ASSL and ACCP Annual Regional Awards Ceremony was held in the Cayman Islands where nine Police Officers from the Caribbean Region were presented with achievement awards along with the three Commissioners of the top awardees. ASSL congratulates the Royal St. Lucia Police Force who nominated Superintendent of Police Dr. Mashama Sealy, First Place Winner of the Top Caribbean Career Move category, and Senior Constable Esnard Flavius, first runner up in the category of Top Caribbean Community Policing Officer.
